Pictures of Christ on Palm Sunday

Matthew 21:1-17 (Mark 11, Luke 19 and John 12)

Ever seen a picture where it seems to be one thing but when you look closer it is far more or sometimes even totally different than you thought at first?

The Triumphant Entry of Christ is like that - far more than we first see. Biblical Background - Why on Sunday before he was to be crucified

Exodus 12:3 - 5 days before the sacrifice of the Passover lamb it must be identified and set aside fully for the Lord - the exact timing of His entrance.

I. He came as the King of Kings

A. He came riding a colt of a donkey

Warriors rode on horses but Kings rode on donkeys

1-7

1. Knowledge of colt given

2. The Lord has need of it - borrowed

3. Owners responded as He had said

B. Coats draped over it was the homage given to a king

Lacking were the heralds, trumpets, officials of state But present were his disciples and a multitude of followers

C. The Prophecy fulfilled Zechariah 9:9

He came righteous and victorious!

II. He came as the Savior of the world 8-11

A. They were looking for a savior from Rome

Palm branches were a national symbol - like waving a flag Giving homage to anyone but Caesar was treason

B. The cried out in victory

Hosanna literally means "save" or "save us" It was their cry of praise to God for freedom

C. Cries among the shouts Luke 19:41-44

Jesus knew the destruction that was coming He wept for they misunderstood His coming

D. The Prophecy fulfilled Psalm 118:25-26

He was indeed coming to save them But from sin and not from Rome

III. He came as the Judge of Truth 12-13

(Note Judges rode on white donkeys and their sons on colts)

A. He cleansed the Temple of those defiling it

Buying and selling - not the problem Different money and cheating was Took up the court of the Gentiles for business

Mark 11 notes - house of prayer for all nations

B. The Prophecy fulfilled

Isaiah 56:7 these I will bring to my holy mountain and give them joy in my house of prayer. Their burnt offerings and sacrifices will be accepted on my altar; for my house will be called a house of prayer for all nations."

Jeremiah 7:11 Has this house, which bears my Name, become a den of robbers to you? But I have been watching! declares the LORD.

IV. He came to fulfill God's Plan 14-17

A. He came as a healer of all brokenness

1. The blind and lame came and were healed

2. The children sang with joy

B. He came as a proclaimer of truth

1. The "seeing and whole" saw and heard but rejected

Psalms 8:2

2. They became indignant and commanded silence

C. The Prophecy fulfilled

The "seeing" could not see but the children could not be silenced! Those who were blind were healed but those who claimed superior sight were still blind to the truth.

Isaiah 61:1-3

His Purpose

He was fitted and qualified for this work:

The Spirit of the Lord God is upon me,

He was appointed and ordained to it:

Because the Lord God has anointed me.

He was to be a preacher of good news

He was to be a healer Bind up the broken hearted

He was to be a deliverer.

To proclaim freedom for the captives and release from darkness for the prisoners, He was to be a comforter,

to comfort all who mourn, and provide for those who grieve in Zion—to bestow on them a crown of beauty instead of ashes, the oil of joy instead of mourning, and a garment of praise instead of a spirit of despair

He was to be a planter

They will be called oaks of righteousness, a planting of the LORD FOR the display of his splendor.
