The fruit of the Spirit - Sharing God with our World Faithfulness, Gentleness, Self-control - Fruit that lasts.

The problem with fruit -

It must be harvested at the right time
It does not last -

Spiritual Fruit

Comes naturally in our relationship to Christ Must be cultivated daily to last

I. Faithfulness (pistis) - Fruit that holds on

A. Definition - Reliability, Trustworthiness

John 15:16 You did not choose me, but I chose you and appointed you so that you might go and bear fruit--<u>fruit that will last</u>--and so that whatever you ask in my name the Father will give you.

B. The Source - God's Faithfulness

Psalm 86:15 But you, Lord, are a compassionate and gracious God, slow to anger, abounding in love and <u>faithfulness.</u>

1 Corinthians 1:9, 1 Corinthians 10:13, 1 Thessalonians 5:24

C. Old Testament examples

Noah - built the Ark for 120 years - had never seen rain Abraham - waited 25 years after promise for a son Daniel - worked and prayed for 70 years to see restoration

D. Expected by Christ

Hard sayings - Luke 9:62 Jesus replied, "No one who puts a hand to the plow and looks back is fit for service in the kingdom of God."

Luke 14:26, John 8:31

E. Product of Focused life

Our commitment is always based in our values
I will commit to what I value Matthew 6:33 -

II. Gentleness (pratues) - Humility in action

A. Definition - meekness (Aristotle - half way between excessive anger and indifference) it is strength under control

Contrast with Kindness and Goodness

Kindness - how we react to cruelty of others Goodness - our reaching out in generosity to others Gentleness - the way we instruct and correct others

B. Seen in the life of Christ

Matthew 11:29 Matthew 23:37

C. Example Paul in Thessalonians

1 Thessalonians 2:7 But we proved to be gentle among you, as a nursing mother tenderly cares for her own children.

D. Especially needed in instructing and correcting others

Galatians 6:1 Brothers and sisters, if someone is caught in a sin, you who live by the Spirit should restore that person gently. But watch yourselves, or you also may be tempted.

1 Corinthians 4:21, 2 Timothy 2:25, Titus 3:2.

III. Self-control (egkrateia) mastery over sinful human desires

A. Definition - possessing power, having mastery, holding in check passions and desires

1 Corinthians 9:25-27

B. Biblical understanding

God is in control of all things *Isaiah 45:6-7*Somethings are totally out of our control - *Matthew 6:27*We are expected to control our passions 2 Peter 1:5-6

C. What we struggle with 1 John 2:16

Lust of the flesh - natural desires out of the plan of God Lust of the eyes - coveting the goods of the world -ingratitude to God Pride of life - seeking the glory that belongs to God alone

D. To gain self-control we must give up control Philippians 2:13

Actions needed to produce lasting Fruit

- 1. Commit all to God 2 Timothy 2:13 If we are unfaithful, he remains faithful, for he cannot deny who he is.
- 2. Humble yourself before God I Peter 5:6 So humble yourselves under the mighty power of God, and at the right time he will lift you up in honor.
- 3. Surrender control of your life fully to Him Romans 12:1
 Therefore, I urge you, brothers and sisters, in view of
 God's mercy, to offer your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and
 pleasing to God this is your true and proper worship.
