"It does not matter how your good deeds are received by men. If you are like God, you will find them received with contempt and ingratitude." (Meyer)

They will rejoice in every sin but have contempt for the right They will slander you - shame you - speak evil of you

Romans 5:3-5 Not only so, but we^[a] also glory in our sufferings, because we know that suffering produces perseverance; ⁴ perseverance, character; and character, hope. ⁵ And hope does not put us to shame, because God's love has been poured out into our hearts through the Holy Spirit, who has been given to us.

A. Anticipate suffering as a testing

B. Acclaim suffering as a blessing

Rejoice to be able to suffer for Christ Acts 5:41

We will rejoice with Him at His revelation When reviled we are treated as Christ was

We can rejoice in the Spirit of glory and God

2 Corinthian 1:8-9 We learn to rely on God - not ourselves Persecution is allowed from God to purify our hearts and lives If we face judgment - think of those without Christ We endure by His grace and glory in us.

D. Assign suffering into God's hands

We suffer according to the will of God

Not His making always but allowed in our lives

We should entrust - deposit our lives in His bank 2 Timothy 1:12

He is faithful - He never fails

He is creator - He created us to bring glory to Him
