Final Words - at death or before major change or even before turning over a job to another - the most important things to remember! For Jesus they show us His concern for His disciples then and now. What were the themes of His final discourse - Love, Peace, Joy - Same as the first three fruits of the Spirit. His message was that the Spirit of God, the Holy Spirit would indeed seal these matters in the hearts of His disciples (1) and (2)

Actual Words - Verses of Love

John 13:1 Before the Passover celebration, Jesus knew that his hour had come to leave this world and return to his Father. He had loved his disciples during his ministry on earth. and now he loved them to the verv end.

34-35 So now I am giving you a new commandment: Love each other. Just as I have loved you, you should: love each other. ³⁵ Your love for one another will prove to the world that you are my disciples."

John 14:15 "If you love me, obey my commandments.¹⁶ And I will ask the Father, and he will give you another Advocate, who will never leave you.

21 Those who accept my commandments and obey them are the ones who love me. And because they love me, my Father will love them. And I will love them and reveal myself to each of them."

23-24 Jesus replied, "All who love me will do what I say. My Father will love them, and we will come and make our home with each of them.²⁴ Anyone who doesn't love me will not obey me. And remember, my words are not my own. What I am telling you is from the Father who sent me.

28 Remember what I told you: I am going away, but I will come back to you again. If you really loved me, you would be happy that I am going to the Father, who is greater than I am

John 15:9-10 "I have loved you even as the Father has loved me. Remain in my love.¹⁰ When you obey my commandments, you remain in my love, just as I obey my Father's commandments and remain in his love.

12-13 This is my commandment: Love each other in the same way I have loved you. ¹³ There is no greater love than to lay down one's life for one's friends.

17 This is my command: Love each other.

John 16:26-27 Then you will ask in my name. I'm not saying I will ask the Father on your behalf, ²⁷ for the Father himself loves you dearly because you love me and believe that I came from God.
