Celebration of His Power

Festival of Pentecost

Exodus 19:18-20, Leviticus 23:15-22, Deuteronomy 16:9-12, and Acts 2:1-13

Big celebrations always include fireworks!! God knows how to throw a really big celebration - Fireworks!!

Review – God gives us reasons to celebrate

His Presence - Festival of Shelters – camping out to remember He dwells among us

His Plan - Festival of Passover – eating in our traveling clothes to remember His deliverance from sin.

Today- His Power - Festival of Weeks (also called Harvest and from Greek, Pentecost)

Event – God's Power to create a new nation called to holiness

Exodus 19:18-20

Marked the Completion of deliverance from Egypt – 50 days to Mount Sinai

Thunder roared and lightning flashed – long, laud blast of a ram's horn The Lord descended in the form of fire and the whole mountain God called Moses to the top of the mountain, law was given

Celebration – Annual celebration of giving of harvest (wheat harvest) and the law

Leviticus 23:15-22

Each man to bring two loaves of bread (made with yeast) to wave Sacrifices offered and a Holy convocation announced (note the gleanings were to be left in the fields for the poor)

Customs - Celebration of David (tradition that he was born and died on Pentecost) and the law

The book of Ruth was read telling of God's hand upon David The book of Exodus or the entire Torah was read commemorating the law. Note – both showed the grace of God on His people - a great King and a holy law

Fulfillment – A spectacular transformation from the Old Covenant to the New Covenant in Christ

Acts 2:1-13

The day of Pentecost was fully come – could be translated completed The believers were waiting as instructed by Christ – 50 days after death, 10 days after ascension Signs

Sound –of mighty windstorm from Heaven

Sight - of tongues of fire settled or sat on each one

Speaking – of languages they had not learned (the wonderful things God has done)

Gift – They were all (men and women) filled with the Holy Spirit

Prophecy - Isaiah, Ezekiel, Joel, Psalms in all over 90 verses in Old Testament

The Holy Spirit was active in creation and many miracles Prophets and Kings were filled with the Spirit for special tasks

John the Baptist proclaimed Him in Matthew 3:11-12 "I baptize with water those who

repent of their sins and turn to God. But someone is coming soon who is greater than I am—so much greater that I'm not worthy even to be his slave and carry his sandals. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and with fire. He is ready to separate the chaff from the wheat with his winnowing fork. Then he will clean up the threshing area, gathering the wheat into his barn but burning the chaff with never-ending fire."

Offered by Jesus to His disciples Luke 24:49 "And now I will send the Holy Spirit, just as my

Father promised. But stay here in the city until the Holy Spirit comes and fills you with power from heaven."

But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon you. And you will be my witnesses, telling people about me everywhere—in Jerusalem, throughout Judea, in Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." Acts 1:8

Meaning of signs and purpose of the gift – the Power of God seen in us.

Mighty wind -Life.

Word for Wind and breath are the same in Hebrew and Greek God breaths life and power into us that we can proclaim His Word.

Fire - Purity

John the Baptists spoke of the separation and cleansing of the Spirit After Pentecost Paul did not speak of the signs but of the cleansing

Acts 15:8-9 God knows people's hearts, and he confirmed that he accepts Gentiles by giving them the Holy Spirit, just as he did to us. He made no distinction between us and them, for he cleansed their hearts through faith.

Languages – Harvest

They were able to speak the languages of the world (at least 16 mentioned) so the message could go to all the world as Christ promised

The curse of Babel was wiped away and the will of God was made known

On that very day 3000 believed and the harvest has not stopped.

Gifts and Ministries - Power to serve

Pentecost is strongly associated with the **gifts** and **ministry** in the power of the Holy Spirit.

On that day for the first time, as far as we know, people spoke in unlearned languages. In the following days, wonderful *healings* took place, *words of knowledge* revealed hidden sin and prison doors were *miraculously* opened. It was a glorious time of divine manifestation. God's hand was visible among his people.

As well as gifts there were ministries. Paul, writing to the Ephesians, speaks of apostles, prophets, pastors, teachers, and evangelists.

Transformation from nation of Israel to nation of believers

David is remembered but not worshipped – for the true King has come The two loaves seem to represent the Jews and non-Jews celebrating before God Most importantly the law is seen as leading us to Christ not to salvation

The law of Moses was unable to save us because of the weakness of our sinful nature. So, God did what the law could not do. He sent his own Son in a body like the bodies we sinners have. And in that body God declared an end to sin's control over us by giving his Son as a sacrifice for our sins. Romans 8:3

Is there a conflict, then, between God's law and God's promises? Absolutely not! If the law could give us new life, we could be made right with God by obeying it. ²² But the Scriptures declare that we are all prisoners of sin, so we receive God's promise of freedom only by believing in Jesus Christ. Galatian 3:21-22

Brothers, listen! We are here to proclaim that through this man Jesus there is forgiveness for your sins. ³⁹ Everyone who believes in him is made right in God's sight—something the law of Moses could never do. Acts 13:38-39

How shall we celebrate?

Follow God's intent – The day was to be marked with rejoicing and the giving of thanks
Offerings that were precious to God were to be given
The whole family – men and women, adults and children were to be involved
Generosity was to shown toward the poor, widows, and orphans

Personally, we are to yield ourselves to the Holy Spirit

Come before God confessing all known sin
Offer yourselves as a living sacrifice to be purified and used
Accept the Holy Spirit's authority and power
Seek ways to serve in the power of the Spirit
Telling all His wonderful works – forgiveness and salvation
Using your spiritual gifts for the good of the whole church

Placing all you are and all you have at His disposal

Two Great reasons to celebrate Pentecost

1. God has provided the Holy Spirit and expects all believers to receive Ephesians 5:18 Do not get drunk on wine, which leads to debauchery. Instead, be filled with the Spirit,

2. God delights to give the Holy Spirit to all who ask

Luke 11:13 If you then, though you are evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will your Father in heaven give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him!"
